In Grand Bethel I have been Region 2 Chairman, 2nd Messenger, and now Grand Bethel Junior Princess.

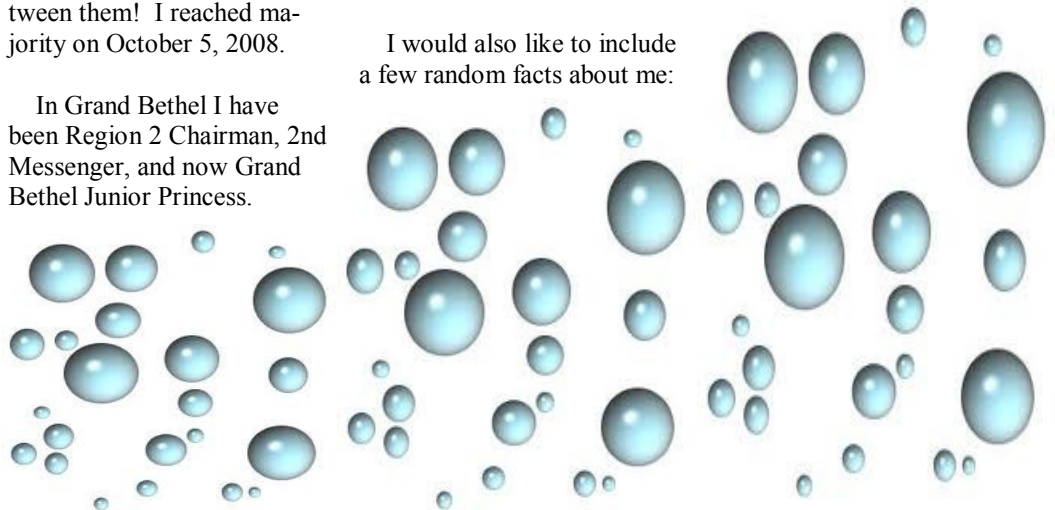

## DEAR MOTHER MICK,

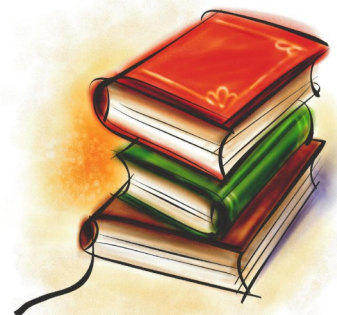

## RUSTIE MILLS, MISS INDIANA JOB'S DAUGHTER



Once again, hello, Job's Daughters of the state of Indiana! As we all know, the leaves are turning, and not only are we approaching the holidays and the New Year, we are also approaching the time for Installations and Retirements. Here are just some notes for ladies and councils preparing their Installations for this December.

For Retirement, make sure the retiring Daughters know how they are to approach the Honored Queen. For instance, in the triangle formation for retirement, each officer approaches the Honored Queen by entering the semi-circle between the second and fifth messengers. For the Retiring Honored Queens, you have several parts during this and the next ceremony. Make sure that you are familiar with the abbreviations, words, and most importantly, your memorized parts of the ceremony for Retirement and the capping and crowning of the new Honored Queen.

The most essential part of an Installation is the officers, both the Installing Officers and the Retiring and Incoming Officers of the Bethel. Ladies planning your Installations, be sure that your Installing Officers are approved, and in your selection of Installing Officers, you adhere to these guidelines:

"The IO [Installing Officer] of a Bethel shall be their own Retiring HQ [Honored Queen]. The other Installing Officers shall be PHQs [Past Honored Queens] of the Bethel. Where PHQs cannot serve, MMs [Majority Members] may be asked to act as IOs.

If an HQ-elect has a special relative or friend who is a PHQ or MM of another Bethel of JDI, she may, with the approval of the Executive members of her BGC, invite not more than one such person to serve as one of her IOs, but not the IO. Where there are not enough PHQs or MMs of a Bethel to act as IOs, a Bethel may ask HQs or PHQs of other Bethels to act for them. When it is impossible to fill the station of Installing Musician according to the requirements above, a musician without these qualifications may serve provided the Executive members of the BGC approve. Whenever possible assisting IOs, i.e., Hostess, Flag Bearer, Narrator, Bible Escort, etc., shall be members of JDI. Adults with proper Masonic relationship may be used as Master or Mistress of Ceremonies, or as Host or Hostess. [...]

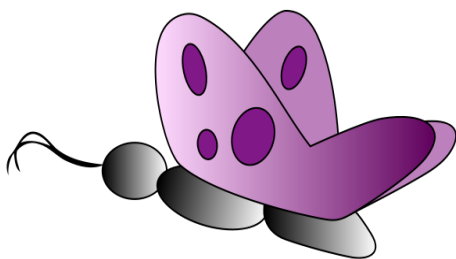
Two other Officers are needed to complete the corps of Installing Officers; they are Acting Marshal and Acting Musician."

Make sure that the Installing Officers and the Daughters retiring and being installed are aware of the date, time, and place of the Installation. Along with ensuring they know this information, it is crucial that you inform them of their responsibilities during the Ceremony and for the term. For instance, the Installing and incoming Chaplain have prayers to deliver throughout the course of the ceremony. In addition, there is provision for other parts of the ceremony, for instance if you have a particular musician or soloist to play your song. These, too, must be approved by the Executive Bethel Guardian Council.

Finally, Retiring Honored Queens and those to be installed, be as organized as possible. Retiring Honored Queens, know the opening and introductions for an open Installation, and incoming Honored Queens, know your presentations and those who should make remarks. Make sure the paraphernalia is in the proper place, the books are ready at the pedestal, and the Officers know what they are supposed to do. Remember, a little organization goes a long way in making this Installation a great experience for all.

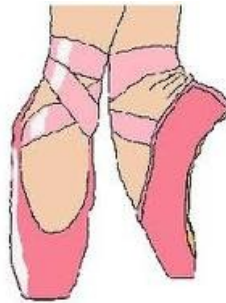
I like visiting other Bethels and making new friends. A girl can never have too many sisters! And the great food is always a bonus!
